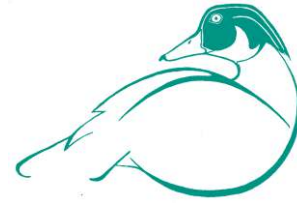

An Introduction to *YourBMP*

***YourBMP* promotes the installation of Best Management Practices (BMPs) on private land through community-based projects in the Potomac Highlands of West Virginia.**

The motto of *YourBMP* is “*Good Neighbors, Great Yards, Best Management Practices*”.

YourBMP sponsors community-driven projects on the neighborhood scale by encouraging collaboration between BMP recipients on private land. Successful projects take a community approach to building a network of BMP recipients who provide support, encouragement, and assistance in installing and maintaining BMPs on private land. By teaming together, homeowners will not only be implementing BMPs on their private property, but also strengthening bonds within their community.

YourBMP encourages environmental stewardship through education and implementation of BMPs such as planting trees, installing rain barrels, disconnecting downspouts, creating walkways with pervious pavers, and installing rain gardens. These BMPs protect rivers and watersheds by reducing the amount of stormwater runoff pollution from residential properties.

YourBMP engages private citizens and provides an avenue for them to get involved in environmental stewardship on their own property through implementing simple, low-cost, and easily installed best management practices.

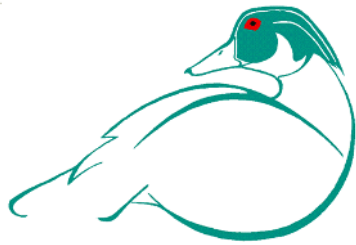
Goals

- Help private homeowners install and maintain best management practices.
- Decrease stormwater runoff pollution
- Educate citizens on BMP installations and maintenance
- Foster an increased awareness of local water quality issues
- Connect citizens with resources to make positive changes in their community
- Promote independent environmental stewardship through education.
- Engage citizens in making priority decisions within their committees.

Requirements

- The project leader will be the liaison between Cacapon Institute and the 6-12 BMP Recipients within their community.
- BMP Recipients will pay 50% of the costs for BMP’s (detailed on Page 3)
- Project timeline must be followed (Cover page)
- BMPs must be installed in Jefferson, Berkeley, Morgan, Mineral, Hampshire, Hardy, or Pendleton Counties in West Virginia.
- The project leader will organize a time and place for Cacapon Institute to deliver a BMP installation demonstration.
- BMPs will be picked up from one of the holding locations (detailed on Page 4)

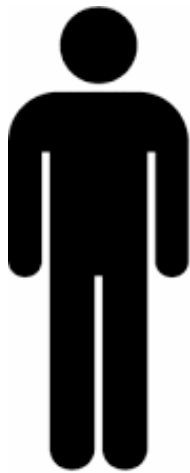
YourBMP – How it Works

- Submit Pre-Proposal by deadline (Page 1)
- Engage at least 6, and no more than 12, homeowners to receive BMPs
- Gather sign-up sheets, orders, and payments from BMP Recipients
- Mail sign-up sheets, orders, and one check for the whole community to Cacapon Institute
- Throughout the project, serves as mediator between Cacapon Institute and BMP recipients
- Pick up BMPs from holding location
- Host a community BMP installation demonstration

- Complete sign-up sheet and place orders with Project Leader by due date (Page 1)
- **Attend community tree planting demonstration to learn about installing BMPs, as well as to pick up BMP installation materials for their home**
- Install and maintain BMPs using the methods described in BMP installation demonstration
- **Submit *YourBMP* online to Cacapon Institute's "What's Your BMP?" tool by due date (page 1)**

Current BMPs

In your proposal, you will need to select one of the following project types for *YourBMP*.

Tree Planting

For tree plantings, we can provide both shade trees (large species) and ornamental trees (small species). In this application, you'll need to decide for your community if you want BMP recipients to be able to receive a smaller quantity of substantial large-stock trees ("Turf-to-Tree") or a larger quantity of small-stock trees ("Field-to-Forest").

Turf-to-Tree:

A "Turf-to-Tree" project provides each participant with 1-2 large stock-size trees (5-7 gallon containers that are 1" caliper and 6-8 feet tall at time of planting). This type of project is recommended for planting landscape trees in a typical residential yard to provide shade and improve aesthetics. Stakes, tubes, and arbor-tie are provided within the cost share program. General guidelines:

- 6-12 recipients
- 1-2 trees per recipient, for a total of 6-24 trees.
- \$25/tree

Field-to-Forest:

A "Field-to-Forest" project provides each participant up to 10 small stock-size trees (2-gallon containers that are 3-4 feet tall at time of planting). This type of project is recommended when many trees are desired for each participant with the goal of restoring understory or converting large open space into forested land. Larger parcels of land are ideal for this type of project. Stakes, tubes, and arbor-tie are provided within the cost share program. General guidelines:

- 6-12 recipients
- 10 trees per recipient, for a total of 60-120 trees.
- \$10/tree

Warm Season Grass Six-Pack

This project is an add-on to tree orders. Each recipient wishing to add warm season grasses to their order will receive six plants (quart size). Warm season grasses help mitigate stormwater and benefit native wildlife. Ideal planting locations are areas prone to stormwater runoff, e.g. ditches, or any low lying area that holds water.

- \$18/6 plants
